The wine geese – Irish wines abroad

The Flight of the Earls took some Wine Geese to France although in more recent years there has been a new flock of 'Irish Wine Geese' to Australia, three in fact. So with three Irish producers in this area, the Wine Geese have found a home in the New World, as well as in the Old World.
